

Upon completion of the Children & Family degree students will be able to:

 Articulate knowledge of family processes and demonstrate the ability to design events and programs to assist parents in the spiritual development of children and the creation of healthy family development.

 Articulate knowledge of family processes and church programming designed to assist parents and families in the spiritual care of their children.

 Analyze contemporary challenges faced by children, and develop strategies of pastoral care and advocacy needed to help them. Students pursuing this degree will engage in core studies of childhood and family life, founded on a biblical worldview and intertwined with a heart for service. There is a balance between scholarly content, practical application, and effective ministry. This graduate degree is designed for:

- Those already working with children and families in a variety of settings.
- Students who have not completed a SAGU undergraduate degree in Children & Family Ministry or Child & Family Studies.
- Preparation for doctoral studies in Children & Family Studies.

Note, this degree does <u>not</u> lead to any type of license or certification.
