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OVERVIEW

The specialization in Worship Ministry is designed to train students for a variety of roles focused on the worship life of the local church. This program equips those who will minister in churches, evangelistic efforts, Christian education settings, professional organizations, and cross-cultural efforts.

Throughout this program of study students will engage in significant field ministry experiences and will partner with local churches through course-required internships.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Students who plan to enter vocational ministry have many options upon completion of the Worship Ministry specialization, as many churches contact SAGU in search of candidates to fill a variety of roles linked to worship ministry, including worship pastor, music director, media pastor, creative arts pastor, and sound engineer. In addition, many of our graduates have pursued a wide variety of master's degrees in order to enhance their ministries to the local church.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

The Worship Ministry specialization provides valuable training and preparation for students who want to pursue worship ministry. This program cultivates leadership abilities through courses taught by accomplished faculty with years of vocational ministry experience.
