## **TOTAL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS 126 Hours**

The purpose of the Youth and Student Ministries program is to prepare students spiritually, academically, professionally, and cross-culturally to reach and develop adolescents both within and outside of the church with an age appropriate and effective communication of Christ. <u>During this program of studies students will engage significant field ministry experiences.</u>

### **Accelerated Graduate Program Opportunity:**

The accelerated BA in Youth and Student Ministries to MA in Practical Theology or Bible and Theology permits students to shorten their educational journey as they pursue a graduate degree

through the Harrison Graduate School. It requires formal admittance to Harrison Graduate School during the second semester of the student's junior year. The student will be required to have a minimim cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.75 for acceptance. Once accepted, the student will be allowed to take one graduate course each of their last two semesters which will be transferrable to Harrison Graduate School or other graduate theological venues upon conferral of their bachelor's degree.

## Upon completion of this program, students will:

- Describe and explain the essential features of effective youth ministry within the local church and contemporary society.
- 2. Explain the essential age-level characteristics and needs of adolescents.
- 3. Present the gospel message effectively in personal and corporate evangelistic settings.
- Demonstrate the ability to design ministry programs which focus on the faith development of adolescents.
- Demonstrate an ability to successfully complete graduate level courses (accelerated BA to MA track).

## **Additional Program Stipulations**

- All full-time students are to include one General Biblical Studies course each semester until degree requirements have been satisfied.
- 2. First-year students enrolled full-time are to include GES 1122 in their first semester schedule.
- 3. First-year students are to enroll in activity physical education courses each of their first two semesters at SAGU. Exceptions will be granted only with approval of the College Dean.
- For Accelerated BA to MA track, students will take the graduate level PTH 5323 Leadership in Ministry course in place of the undergraduate course CMN 3163.
