Students will be equipped with the practical knowledge of fundamental core business principles in Accounting, Finance, Management, and Marketing. Students will also take courses in Economics, Law, Statistics, Ethics, Management Communications, and Technology. Furthermore, students will participate in experiential learning opportunities throughout their courses by completing real-world projects, simulations, case analysis, and an internship opportunity to apply critical thinking and decision-making skills to real-world scenarios. The B.A. degree is rooted in the Christian view of business and prepares students to function successfully in the business marketplace regardless of the specific direction the Lord may direct their path such as running their own business, working for a small business or non-profit, or working with a larger firm.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

According to Research.com, the business administration career outlook is projected to grow faster than all other occupations as shared in the Bureau of Labor Statistics report in 2021. Salaries are also substantial with a bachelor's degree salary ranges from \$50k-80k depending on the degree level, the industry, and the position in the company. Students graduating with a Bachelor of Arts in Business (B.A.) degree will gain a business & Biblical foundation for future career opportunities.
