#### **OVERVIEW**

The Business Sport Management Program was established to provide students with knowledge and experience in the sports marketplace. These focal points include management, marketing, administration, sports law, ethics, and most importantly, a Christian worldview of sports. Each of our instructors has real-world experience in the area of sport management.

#### CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Graduates from this program have gone on to pursue careers including sport management, sport marketing, sport facilities management, coaching, and athletic administration, and pursue graduate degrees in Sport Management.

The bureau of labor statistics (August '22) published a jobs report showing that sport management jobs will grow by 15%, faster than most other roles. These include coaches, scouts, sports-related workers, and sports agents. Recreational managers, facility directors, and athletic director positions will grow by 10% faster than most other roles. The opportunities in sport management are endless! Salaries are also substantial, ranging from \$45K to \$100K per year depending on the field and career. There is so much potential for managing and leading in sports.

#### PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

SAGU boasts some very successful alumni who have gone on to coach at the high school and college level, manage sport facilities, and be athletic directors and owners of sports clubs.
