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OVERVIEW

The specialization in *Children & Family Ministries* is designed to train students for a variety of professional roles focused on ministry to the needs of children and families. This program is designed for those who will minister in churches, evangelistic efforts, Christian education settings, professional organizations, and cross-cultural efforts. During this program of studies students will engage significant field ministry experiences.

Upon completion of this program, students will:

- Develop a personal philosophy of Children and Family Ministries.
- Discover personal talents and ministry preferences through exposure to various approaches of children and family ministry.
- Develop creative programming and deliver biblical truths in a wide variety of settings, through a wide variety of teaching methods.
- Administer pastoral care and advocacy to and for children and families affected by a variety of societal issues and special needs.
- Create and direct family ministries that include: help and resources for parents to disciple their children; opportunities for family members to minister together; and intergenerational efforts.
- Direct an entire children and family ministry program, including the recruitment, development, and management of staff.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Those desiring to enter vocational ministry to children have many options upon graduation, as many churches and pastors contact SAGU in hopes to fill children's pastorates. Our graduates have become pastors of children and family ministries, missionaries in foreign and U.S. contexts, directors of non-profit organizations, and other career roles. In addition, many of our graduates have pursued a wide variety of master's degrees in order to enhance their ministries to children (education, counseling, social work, etc.)

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Whereas a number of children's-ministry-preparation degree programs exist, ours offers students extra depth into understanding and ministering to children and families with a variety of issues. This includes practical training that our graduates use when asked to counsel children and families in a church setting. Dr. Daugherty's experience, training, and professional licensures/certifications help him bring great depth to our program.
