




It will not be the big things you do in life that will obtain necessarily the final reward, but just being FAITHFUL.



Why Students from 20 States Came to Shield of Faith Bible Institute

LOCATION

The Shield of Faith Bible Institute is located at 2115 Belle Avenue, North Fort Worth, Texas. The school buildings stand on a hill over looking the city, at the intersection of Twenty-Second Street and Belle Avenue. Fort Worth is one of the great cities in the South. It has modern conveniences, beautiful parks, nice homes, good schools, and thriving business concerns. Here the people are typically Southern in hospitality and Western in friendliness. The Institute is within an hour's drive from the city of Dallas, and many small cities and towns are easily accessible over paved highways. Here the climate is mild, and the days are pleasant most of the time. There is very little snow during the Winter, Spring comes early, and Autumn lingers long.

ORGANIZATION

Shield of Faith Bible Institute is incorporated under the laws of the State of Texas, and operated under the direction of a Board of Directors, composed of seven Assembly of God men, four of whom are ordained ministers, two business men, and one a farmer. These are appointed by, and amenable to the Texas District Officiary of the Assemblies of God. Of this group Rev. Guy Shields is President; Rev. Millard E. Collins, Vice-President; Rev. O. B. Braune, Business Manager; and Wm. F. Shipp, Secretary-Treasurer. These compose the executive board: Rev. Carl Stewart, Brother E. C. King and Brother Leonard Shields are the other three members of the Board of Directors. Working in cooperation with the Board of Directors is an Advisory Board composed of the Texas District Superintendent, Rev. F. D. Davis, the Texas District Secretary, Rev. E. B. Crump, and Rev. Wm. B. McCafferty.

The School is organized into many departments including a full four year standard high school, a full three year standard Bible School, a business college department, and a music department.

FACULTY

One of the outstanding features of the School is its faculty. In every department we have secured teacher who have not only the educational qualifications to teach the subjects that they teach, but a wide background of experience as teachers and workers in Christian work. Our faculty have taken their academic preparation in widely distributed schools and colleges, in various states.

SUMMER SCHOOL

In addition to the regular courses offered in the fall and winter terms, we also have a Summer School which lasts from the close of the winter term until the Summer Camp Meeting. The Summer School covers a period of eight weeks, and students may take two semester units of credit in High School department during these eight weeks. This short course is especially helpful to students who wish to get some practical schooling in the Bible or who wish to complete the work in the other department a little sooner. Our whole faculty does not stay here during the summer. Some go away for additional schooling, others will be away in evangelistic work, but a sufficient staff of workers will be maintained to accommodate all who come for the summer school work.

SHIELD OF FAITH ANNUAL CAMP MEETING

For ten days prior to and including the fourth of July the school conducts a big camp meeting. In addition to Brother Shields and members of the faculty, capable and experienced camp meeting speakers and ministers of prominence in the Brotherhood appear of the program. The camp grounds are within a few minutes ride of the beautiful parks in the city of Fort Worth, which cover hundreds of acres of beautiful timbered grounds affording cool, comfortable resting places while the camp meeting is not in session. New and special arrangements are being made for this year to take care of the large number of people whom we expect to attend this great event.


EXTENSION WORK

While students are getting their training in the class room they are also given practical training in the extension department. In addition to the churches here in the city giving them an opportunity to assist in the services, there are many outstations and many places where outstation work will be established as rapidly as possible. In this work students get experience of actually winning souls to Christ and working in the altars, as well as preaching, singing, playing instruments, etc.

COST TO STUDENTS

The cost of attending school at Shield of Faith is very little as compared with the great advantages that young people have here. Young people are attending school from many states.
