Through partnership with the Communication Arts Department and Practical Ministries, students learn through hands-on activities utilizing the same technology used in local churches. Students are equipped to serve the church by effectively communicating the Gospel through a variety of media.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Students serve in a variety of locations and positions across the nation. Some serve as media directors for the local church, managing the in-service production needs. Some serve through advertising and running social media.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- The hands-on approach to training is important in media ministry. Many students will serve on the media team at their local church while enrolled in the program. This allows the opportunity to put into practice skills they are learning in the classroom. There are students who will couple their media education with their musical skills to serve as a worship pastor.
- Students have the opportunity to participate in a variety of on-campus experiences in television and video production.
