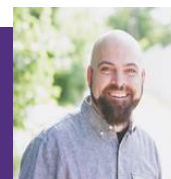

Students learn to integrate biblical truth and spiritual disciplines to develop and equip Christians of all ages.

### CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

The student will discover how to effectively lead people of all ages in discipleship with an understanding of how life stages effect how they understand themselves and God. Small group ministry receives special attention as many students organize and direct those ministries in the local church. Others serve in writing spiritual formation curriculum.

Small group leadership training is being done and curriculum written to help people go deeper in their relationship with Christ.
