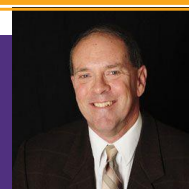

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OVERVIEW

The purpose of the Bachelor's Degree in History is to prepare undergraduate students to provide quality educational and professional Christian service by gaining a comprehensive understanding of history and related disciplines and research techniques.

Famous people with History degrees include Presidents Theodore Roosevelt, Richard Nixon, John F. Kennedy, and Franklin D. Roosevelt; Supreme Court justices Elena Kagan, Antonin Scalia, and Anthony Kennedy; and leaders Newt Gingrich, W.E.B. DuBois, and Henry Kissinger.

History is valuable in not only what it teaches of the past, but in what it can show us about the present. We learn from history how other people in different times and locations approached problems that are often very similar to ones we face today. One of the skills gained from that study is the practice of critical thinking, which our graduates can use in a variety of life experiences they may face in the future.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

History graduates experience success in the fields of education, business, government and public service, and any other field that involves analyzing situations, conducting research, solving problems, and applying knowledge gained in one area to challenges in another. History graduates are thinkers, they are writers, and they are people who turn lessons from the experiences of others into success in the contemporary world. Training in history serves as excellent preparation for a number of other fields. Our graduates, for example, often go into law; several have transitioned smoothly in to law school after graduation from SAGU and have become successful attorneys. Law professors often consider a history degree as one of the best preparations for the legal field.
